

Privacy Statement for the ANTICSS website

Privacy Statement

Thank you for visiting the ANTICSS website and taking an interest in our work. We take the protection of your personal data very seriously. This Privacy Statement explains what personal information we collect during your visit to our website and what it is used for.

1. Use and sharing of personal data

The personal data provided by you is logged solely for administrative purposes within our ANTICSS project, e.g. to manage subscriptions to our Newsletter or to register to events. We never pass on, sell or otherwise disclose your personal data to third parties. When you send us an e-mail, your e-mail address is used solely for corresponding with you and for no other purpose.

2. Security

The ANTICSS project team takes all the necessary technical and organisational measures to protect your personal data against loss or misuse. Users who contact the ANTICSS website by e-mail are made aware that the confidentiality of information contained in non-encrypted e-mails cannot be guaranteed.

3. Use of social media buttons

On our website, we include social media buttons to enable you to view content on Twitter. Clicking on these buttons does not activate “like” functions or similar, and none of your personal data is shared. Instead, by clicking, you open a window to the share function and the current page’s URL. Any further activity then takes place via the relevant operator’s website.

4. Our services

- **Newsletters**

Sign-ups to our ANTICSS newsletters require a double opt-in. This means that we will only send you our Newsletter and selected news items by e-mail if you confirm that we should activate your subscription request. The first request is made when you submit your e-mail address to the online form. When we receive your initial request, a confirmation e-mail is sent to the e-mail address provided by you on the form. The e-mail contains a link which you must click to confirm your subscription request. Once you have subscribed, we store your e-mail address and use it to send you our Newsletters. We also log the date of subscription.

The Newsletter itself always includes a link enabling you to delete or update your information.

- **Registering for events**

We also use a double opt-in registration system with an online form for ANTICSS events) at www.anticircumvention.eu. The personal data requested (generally name, institution, job title, e-mail address) is used solely for the purpose of organising the event in question (producing name badges, compiling a list of participants) and is deleted afterwards.

5. Your rights

You can contact us at any time to request information about your stored data. If the personal information we hold is inaccurate, you may ask for it to be corrected. You may also withhold consent to the use of your data or ask for it to be deleted. We will notify you if your personal information is affected by a data leak or a breakdown in data security. You may also file a complaint with the local regulator.

6. Amendment of the Privacy Statement

We reserve the right to amend this Privacy Statement at any time, should this become necessary in light of new technological developments or changes in the law.
